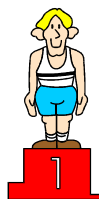

National Swim, Adelaide.

1-4 April, 2004.

4 ½ Miami Swimmers travelled to South Australia for the Australian Masters Championships. 437 competitors representing 67 Masters Clubs from around Australia competed at the Adelaide Aquatic Centre. Despite our small number, we managed to come 11th overall, with John and Denise each winning their Age Group, Julie coming 2nd and Brett 4th. *Bruce was our "half a competitor", swimming in only 4 of the possible



12 events, but nevertheless gaining 27 valuable points for the team.

Both John and Julie were on fire - John breaking 2 National and 5 State records, and Julie 1 of each. Our two relays both achieved gold, with the Mixed Freestyle breaking the State record.

So dedicated were we to win these relays, that all of us drew out of individual events in order to be fresh for the relays!



Masters Swimmers are an unusual lot - the first few hours of a National Meet are spent warmly greeting familiar faces from other clubs and other states - sort of like an extended family. Then the races begin and although we're competing against each other, we are still able to share their successes and sympathise in their disappointments as we analyse our respective performances. Weird but true.

We were lucky to have both Bernice and Max as supporters and, as usual, they did a great job checking out the competition, taking splits, and photos, and generally offering encouragement and help. This Meet was 4 very long and very tiring days, but we nonetheless managed to have some fun together, and share a hearty celebratory dinner at the end.

Oceania Masters One Hour Swim

Results and medals have arrived for the New Zealand run, Oceania Masters One Hour Swim Competition. I sensed a twinge of disappointment when I phoned Phil Marshall to say that she had NOT won the gold medal for Females, 70-74. This turned to joy and hilarity, when I informed her that she had won gold for MALES, 70-74! Full results - gold medals to Margaret Kelly, Denise Robertson and Phil.
